Nedow called for nominations for Chairman.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce nominating Jim Calhoun as Chairman of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County for the ensuing year.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion approved.

Nedow then turned the meeting over to Calhoun.

Nominations for Vice-chairman:

Motion by Popa, supported by Calhoun nominating John Popa as Vice-chairman of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County for the ensuing year.

Aves: Calhoun, Popa, and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion approved.

Appointed staff positions:

Managing Director:

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to appoint Dan Wagner as Managing Director of the Leelanau County Road Commission for the ensuing year.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion approved.

Secretary to the Board:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to appoint Joe Nedow as Secretary to the Board of the Leelanau County Road Commission for the ensuing year (Nedow to continue his dual role as Finance Manager which is reportable to the Managing Director.)

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion approved.

2017 Meeting Schedule:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa, to set the 2017 Leelanau County Road Commission regular meeting schedule for the first and third Tuesdays of each month (except the first meeting in July, which is changed to Wednesday, July 5^{th}), with all meetings starting at 1:00 p.m. in the Suttons Bay conference room. Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion approved.

Calhoun then closed the organizational meeting and convened the regular meeting.

Agenda: Popa asked to include a discussion regarding notification when attending meetings be added to the agenda under "Old Business". Calhoun and Joyce agreed and the agenda was updated accordingly.

Vouchers 39383 thru 39403 in the amount of \$44,014.75 were approved for payment.

Minutes from the December 20, 2016 regular session were approved.

Public Comments: None.

Correspondence:

Email dated December 31, 2016 from Brian Merkel who resides on South Bay Bluffs Drive, Cleveland Township. Merkel asked Calhoun to inspect the damage done to his yard by a plow truck which he opined would take two days to clean up and reseed his lawn. Merkel's email stated he had spoken to Manager Wagner about the damage but still wanted Calhoun to personally inspect the damage. Wagner stated he sent a response to Merkel informing him work crews would inspect the damage in the spring and fix the damage if warranted, but from what he can see from the photos supplied by Merkel, the damage appears to be minimal. He also informed the Board that last year, Priest had to send road workers out to Merkel's property to remove stakes that were driven into the ground within the platted road right of way and at the edge of the pavement in response to neighbors' complaints.

Calhoun: expressed his opinion that the situation was handled properly and no further action is warranted.

Popa: expressed his preference that the Road Commission should not repair lawns or reinstall sprinklers damaged during snow removal activities. Priest replied that in instances where the pavement is uneven or sloped, it is necessary to restore those lawns with significant damage. But for the most part, he further stated this occurs infrequently.

Appointments: None.

Management Reports:

Heard brief reports from Wagner, Priest, Johnson and Nedow.

Proposed "Political and Other Temporary Signs in the Right of Way" policy:

Proposed by Wagner, this policy addresses political and other temporary signs placed in the road right of way and is designed to ensure these signs do not pose a safety hazard by impeding anyone's vision or creating a dangerous distraction. Wagner also pointed out that this proposed policy is consistent with those adopted by the Michigan Department of Transportation and more recently adopted by Grand Traverse County Road Commission.

Discussion ensued. Popa stated that the regulation requiring someone to obtain permission from the adjacent property owner prior to placing signs in the right of way is confusing and should be clarified. Wagner suggestion to omit any reference to the right of way from this sentence was acceptable to Popa.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to adopt the proposed "Political and Other Temporary Signs in the Right of Way" policy as presented (including the edit suggested by Wagner).

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion approved.

Schedule public hearing: changes to Seasonal Road System:

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce, to schedule a public hearing for Tuesday, February 21, 2017 starting at 1:15 p.m. during the regular meeting to hear public comments related to the proposed changes to the Road Commission's Seasonal Road system.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion approved.

Meeting notifications when quorum is present:

Popa asked Nedow for clarification about this discussion at the December 20, 2016 regular meeting. Nedow explained that when there is a reasonable expectation that two or more Road Commissioners are attending a meeting, social event or gathering, it would be prudent to publish a notice of quorum posting so that there is no perceived violation of the Open Meetings Act even if no Road Commission issues are discussed. He is therefore asking each Commissioner to notify him of their itinerary prior to such an event so that he can ensure the proper postings are published on our website.

Public Comments: None.

Commissioner comments:

Calhoun: suggested attending the New Commissioner workshop would be worthwhile attending. AIS salesman Daniel Novak informed the Board that this one day event is scheduled in Lansing on March 14, 2017 as part of the 2017 Highway Conference. Joyce and Calhoun stated they will notify Nedow if they are planning on attending.

Calhoun also asked to discuss County Administrator Janik's request to the Road County Board asking for their position on changing Road Commissioner compensation. He referenced the December 13, 2016 County Board of Commissioners' Executive Board meeting minutes where Popa had asked (speaking for himself and not on behalf of the Road Commission) the County Board to address increasing the Road Commission Board to five members; address Road Commissioner compensation which has not been changed in many years including per diem payments; and eliminate health insurance coverage for Road Commissioners. Popa then reported attending the December 20, 2016 County Board of Commissioner regular meeting where a three-member committee was appointed to investigate Popa's request.

Calhoun then referred to the September 1, 2015 and the November 3, 2015 Road Commission meeting minutes when the Board had discussed commissioner compensation. At that time, Joyce and Calhoun had stated they were satisfied with their current compensation package. Calhoun stated he still feels the same way today, and Joyce stated he too has not changed his position on this matter.

Motion by Calhoun, supported by Joyce directing Nedow to write a letter to County Administrator Janik/County Board of Commissioners that the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County is satisfied with their current compensation package (as discussed and decided upon at the September 1, 2015 Road Commission regular meeting and re-affirmed at the November 3, 2015 regular meeting) and has no desire to ask the County Board of Commissioners to change it.

Discussion: Popa stated he would prefer to wait for more information on what other road commissions are paying their Board members before making a decision.

Vote: Ayes: Calhoun and Joyce. Nays: Popa. - Motion is approved.

With no more business to conduct, Calhoun adjourned the meeting at 1:48 p.m.

-Audit engagement letter dated January 5, 2017 from Thomas Smith of Smith & Klacziewicz PC outlining the process being followed for performing the Road Commission's 2016 financial audit.

Popa stated the letter included a separate cost for the auditor to present the reports to the Board. He suggested the annual report could be done remotely or even not at all, depending on the preference of the other Board members. Nedow's recommendation that the Board could wait until the reports including any recommendations have been completed before deciding was agreed upon.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce, authorizing Chairman Calhoun to sign the audit engagement letter from Smith & Klacziewicz for the 2016 Road Commission financial audit on behalf of the Board. Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion is approved.

Appointments: None.

Management Reports:

Heard brief reports from Wagner and Nedow.

Proposed updates to Road Commission Right of Way Standards/Fee schedule:

Wagner provided a revised "County Right of Way Standards" that include the following:

- -A paved driveway must have a six foot minimum paved shoulder beyond the radius and a twenty foot taper (replaces a ten foot minimum paved shoulder and fifteen foot long taper).
- -Under "Land Division" added the sentence "Reductions to the required stopping sight distance will not be considered for type of road, side slopes, road grades or advisory speed (yellow) signs."
- -Under "Other improvements": Altering, moving or removing road features (signs, pavement markings, culverts, pavement, shoulders etc.) is not allowed unless approved in writing by the Road Commission. The Road Commission will issue permits to allow changes to road features only when Road Commission staff determines that the change(s) would be an improvement in the best interest of the motoring public.
- -On sketch #5 "Commercial Driveway Approach Detail" has been updated to include this caption: "Typical commercial driveway width shall be 30'. Uses determined to generate minimal trips can be reduced to 24'. Uses determined to generate excessive trips may be required to be increased to 40'. This will be determined at the discretion of the Road Commission Engineer."

Wagner stated these changes/additions are the result of recent events which is precipitated the need for the revisions.

Motion by Popa, supported by Calhoun, to adopt the revised Road Commission "Right of Way Standards" as presented by staff.

Discussion: Joyce stated that while he understands the need for pavement on commercial driveways to protect our roads, he is still not convinced it is necessary to require concrete curbing for all commercial driveway applications.

Vote: Ayes: Calhoun and Popa. Nays: Joyce. Motion is approved.

Schedule public hearing: revised permit fee schedule:

Staff then presented a proposed revised permit fee schedule. Wagner stated Johnson obtained a list of road commissions on the eastern side of the State which he used as a basis to help him determine which permit fees should be increased. He is proposing doubling the residential, multi-residential and commercial driveway permit application fees. He is also recommending increasing the commercial driveway escrow deposit requirements for HMA paving and curb & gutter by \$2,000.00 each to ensure adequate funds exist to cover our costs should an applicant fail to make the required improvements. For private utility permits, staff proposes to double this fee along with miscellaneous permits minimum charge.

For transportation permits, Johnson reported the County Road Association permit recently adopted for State wide application for Mobile Home – single move is \$50.00 when our fee is \$25.00 and that our fee should be changed accordingly.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa, to schedule a public hearing on Tuesday, March 7, 2017 at 1:15 p.m. during the regular meeting so that the public can respond to the Board on the proposed revised permit fee schedule.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

<u>Proposed "Drive Permits on Unimproved Roads" and "Upgrades to Seasonal and Unimproved Roads" policies:</u>

Calhoun and Joyce stated they would prefer to wait until after the February 21, 2017 seasonal road public hearing before discussing adopting either policy. Until then, Calhoun instructed Nedow to keep this topic on future agendas under "Old Business".

Public Comments: None.

Commissioner comments:

Calhoun: with recent icy driving conditions, he estimated our plow trucks applied almost a thousand tons of material on county roads in one day. He also asked Wagner to pass on his thanks to the men for the good job that they are doing keeping their routes open during adverse conditions.

With no more business to conduct, Calhoun adjourned the meeting at 1:52 p.m.

CR-685: this route follows old M-209 from M-109 northerly to the end of the road at Glen Harbor Bay, 0.45 miles long. This road was designated as a Primary Road and Major Collector (NFC designation) when MDOT "turned back" this former state highway to the Road Commission, and

At 1:15 p.m. Calhoun opened the public hearing to listen to comments regarding proposed changes to the Road Commission's Seasonal Road system.

Oral comments in favor of the proposed changes: none. Written comments in favor of the proposed changes: none received.

Oral comments <u>not</u> in favor of the proposed changes: None. Written comments <u>not</u> in favor of the proposed changes: None.

Popa stated that he would like to see Sharnowski Road remain as a seasonal road. While the Road Commission will continue to plow it, he believes the road is in poor condition and likely to be costly to upgrade. He therefore suggests that it should continue to be listed as a seasonal road.

Johnson informed the Board that the list posted on the Road Commission's website needs to be corrected for three road names listed incorrectly: Good Harbor Trail (listed as Good Harbor Road), Kasson Road (listed as East Kasson Road) and Seven Pines Road (listed as Lighthouse Road).

Calhoun then closed the public hearing at 1:25 p.m. and returned to open session.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to approve Resolution No. 17-01 which reads as follows:

Popa asked Nedow to investigate if a motion to authorize check signing by title instead of by name would be possible to avoid adopting a similar motion in the future if staff members change.

Loader bids: staff recommendation:

Albrecht provided a written recommendation to accept the Volvo 90H loader bid for \$182,356.00 submitted by ALTA Equipment of Traverse City. While it was the highest bid received, Albrecht stated he believes this model has the desired weight and horsepower necessary to perform those task needed by the Road Commission.

Discussion ensued concerning whether or not the specifications contained in the bid documents were vague causing confusion among the vendors who submitted quotes. While Michigan CAT and AIS equipment quoted models that had lower horsepower and less weight, Alta Equipment submitted bids for three different sizes. Comments about the bid specifications were offered by AIS salesman Daniel Novak.

Calhoun asked for a motion to accept the ALTA Equipment bid for the Volvo 90H loader. None were made. Calhoun then asked if there was a motion to accept any of the bids received. None were made.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Calhoun to reject the bids received on February 7th, revise the loader bid specifications and to solicit new bids.

Proposed "Drive Permits on Unimproved Roads" and "Upgrades to Seasonal and Unimproved Roads" policies:

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to adopt the "Drive Permits on Unimproved Roads" proposed policy as presented. Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion is approved.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to adopt the "Upgrades to Seasonal and Unimproved Roads" proposed policy as presented.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nay: None. - Motion is approved.

Proposed Administrative Employee handbook:

Wagner reported making some edits to the proposed draft based on suggestions received from Attorney Tom Derderien. Once the review process has concluded, he will present the final draft to the Board for approval at a later meeting.

Discussion: discontinue allowing Engineer to take a Road Commission vehicle home at night:

Wagner provided a written report to the Board listing reasons why he is recommending continuing the current and past practice of allowing the Engineer to drive a vehicle to and from his residence. Wagner also pointed out this practice is being followed consistently as addressed in the Road Commission's Personal Use of Road Commission Vehicle Policy.

Discussion ensued by the Board who expressed their individual opinions on the matter.

Calhoun then stated he would entertain a motion to discontinue the practice of allowing the Engineer to take a Road Commission vehicle home at night. None was offered.

Discussion: back-up for Maple City Foreman:

Grimaldi stated that he has someone at Maple City who can fill in for him on those days when he is not there. In regards to Joyce's suggestion that Wagner not perform weekend winter patrol, Wagner pointed out that his job description includes the Manager performing this function. He also stated that he has learned a lot about our operation while patrolling on weekends, but that he is not planning on continuing doing this on a long term basis. Wagner also pointed out that since he is a salaried position, there is no additional cost to the Road Commission.

Managing Director job description and review.

After discussion, the Board concluded that the three members will discuss how they will proceed with a job review for Wagner at their next meeting that will be based upon his job description.

Public Comments:

Jennifer Smeltzer, formerly of Representative Ray Franz office and who now works for the Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association introduced herself to the Board and provided a brief summary of what her organization does.

AIS Salesman Daniel Novak asked the Board to include the possibility of including a lease option when the revised loader bids are published to accommodate vendors who are unable to offer a guaranteed repurchase price which he believes puts him at a disadvantage.

Commissioner comments:

Calhoun stated that with labor contract negotiations expected to start soon (present union agreement expires on June 30, 2017) and he would like to formally name the Managing Director and the Road Commission's labor attorney as the Board's negotiating representatives.

Motion by Calhoun, supported by Popa naming the Managing Director and the Road Commission's labor attorney as the Board's representatives for upcoming contract negotiations with the union membership.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion is approved.

With no more business to conduct, Calhoun adjourned the meeting at 2:39 p.m.

-Letter dated February 24, 2017 from the State of Michigan – Financial Operations Division announcing that the Office of Commission Audits has completed their analysis of the maintenance reports submitted for the period January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015. Their findings are showing a refund of \$121,147.00 which will be added to our next maintenance payment.

When Popa asked if it would be possible to increase our monthly Trunkline maintenance billing each month instead of waiting for a refund, Nedow responded that increasing our monthly routine billings to MDOT would not be prudent as doing so would exhaust our winter budget and most of our summer Trunkline routine maintenance budget prematurely.

- -For commercial and multi-residential driveways where HMA paved surface and/or concrete curb & gutter are required by the Road Commission to guarantee completion: change the \$4,000.00 escrow deposit to \$6,000.00; and where curb & gutter are required, the additional escrow deposit of \$4,000.00 is changed to \$6,000.00.
- -Utility permits private utility: change from \$50.00 to \$100.00.
- -Miscellaneous permits: change minimum charge from \$50.00 to \$100.00.
- -Transportation permit: Mobile Home, single move change fee from \$25.00 to \$50.00.

Popa and Joyce expressed their concerns that any wage increases should also take into account the recent increase to the administrative health insurance monthly caps approved this past November. Nedow explained the adjustment was necessary as rising deductibles and out-of-pocket costs have eroded our health care coverage. Since the inception of the contract caps, administrative wage adjustments have not kept up with these rising deductibles. This trend has also made it difficult to hire replacement workers as our benefit package is no longer competitive.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to accept the bid for a Kubota SVL95-2SHFC skid steer for \$63,951.49 and for a Harley model MX7H-022 power rake for \$8,499.00 offered by Ginop Sales as doing so would be in the Road Commission's best interests.

Minutes from the March 21, 2017 regular session were approved.

Appointments:

At 1:00 PM the Board met with Networks Northwest representative Tad Erickson, BATA representatives Kelly Dunham and Kirt Braun and Bingham Township Supervisor Midge Werner to review federal-aid eligible road and transit projects in accordance with the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST Act) legislation.

Wagner explained the County-wide meeting is the first step in order to have projects introduced to the 10C Rural Task Force. A Task Force meeting is scheduled for later this month. No changes to the list of eligible road projects can be made at this time, but new projects can be added including a listing of new illustrative projects. In the unlikely event additional funds become available project(s) can be submitted from this illustrative list of standby projects. Wagner presented a list of proposed projects on behalf of Engineer Johnson who was in training. All present agreed to the list as presented and no new projects were proposed by the others. Popa suggested staff should hire an outside contractor to prepare design plans in the event funds become available for additional work.

Wagner also suggested that the Board adopt a motion authorizing staff to designate a portion of CR-669 north of M-22 as a future All-Season road. While this stretch of road is not capable of supporting high volume traffic, the new designation would make it possible for staff to seek alternative funding sources should this stretch of road be upgraded in the future. After further discussion, no action was taken at this time.

Communications:

-A letter dated March 31, 2017 from Peter B. Worden Jr of Garan, Lucow and Miller P.C. regarding Leland Township v Zimmer et al. lawsuit along with a petition to abandon. The petition is asking the Leelanau County Road Commission to formally abandon and vacate the alley in Block 1 of the Plat of Brown's Addition to the Village of Leland. He is also asking the Road Commission to formally approve the settlement and the entry of the Judgement previously circulated. Worden also submitted a Petition to Abandon County Road for this undeveloped, platted alley.

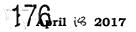

A regular meeting of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County was called to order by Chairman Jim Calhoun at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 1/3 2017 at 10550 E. Eckerle Road, Suttons Bay, Michigan. Present: Chairman Jim Calhoun, Vice-chairman John Popa, Member Robert Joyce, Managing Director Dan Wagner and Finance Manager/Secretary to the Board Joe Nedow. Guests were present.

Agenda: approved as presented.

Vouchers 39610 thru 39654 in the amount of \$222,380.56 were approved for payment.

Minutes from the April 4, 2017 regular session and April 4, 2017 special meeting were approved.

Public Comments: None.

Appointments:

1:05 PM: presentation/acceptance of 2016 audited financial statements and Act 51 report:

Thomas Smith CPA of Smith & Klaczkiewicz presented the audited financial statements and Act 51 report to the Board. The audit concluded that the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Road Commission (an unqualified opinion). New this year is a performance audit which is required this year as part of the 2012 State of Michigan legislation.

As in previous audits, the report also includes a lack of segregation - incompatible duties. As with most small Michigan road commissions, the accounting staff is too small to adequately ensure proper segregation of duties. While no specific remedies were offered, Smith encouraged the Board and management to continue to actively seek ways to strengthen internal controls and independent review using qualified staff members whenever possible. The report further states the Board is aware of this deficiency but concludes the costs to implement corrective measures out-weigh the inherent risks.

The report also included the finding that the Road Commission exceeded the 10% threshold of PA 51 of 1951 Section 12(21) that stipulates that not more than 10% of the Michigan Transportation Funds (MTF) received during the year be expended for administrative costs. While staff was not aware of this requirement, corrective measures have been implemented and should not be a problem in subsequent years.

Motion by Popa supported by Joyce to accept the audited 2016 financial statements as prepared and presented to the Leelanau County Road Commission Board by Thomas Smith of Smith & Klaczkiewicz.

Discussion: None.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Nedow also presented a copy of the Act-51 report for the Board to review. Popa stated that he never saw this report before and questioned Smith if he had reviewed the report. Nedow informed Popa that this report, filed with the State of Michigan – Department of Transportation by June 1st each year, is the basis for which the audited financial statements are based upon which was also confirmed by Smith. Smith also offered suggestions as to the types of transactions which have a higher risk factor which the Board should continue to be aware of when reviewing monthly accounts payable and payroll transactions. He also suggested that to further strengthen internal controls, the Managing Director could open and distribute the daily mail instead of the accounting staff.

Motion by Popa supported by Joyce to accept the 2016 State of Michigan Act-51 report as prepared by Nedow (Finance Manager) and reviewed by Thomas Smith of Smith & Klaczkiewicz.

Discussion: None.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Communications: None.

Management Report - Wagner:

- -Maintenance: road crews are continuing efforts to focus on street sweeping in village centers where we have County roads and crews are also working on dangerous tree removals, road patching, drainage improvements on gravel roads. In the coming weeks our crews will be moving into other activities such as shoulder peeling and crack sealing before moving into sealcoating and fog sealing operations.
- -New tracked skid steer and power rake attachment have been delivered and tested. The tool performed well and appears to be very effective in smoothing small areas of rough gravel roads that require significant attention.
- -New handheld radios have been received. The change-over date when the County Emergency Services high band system will be replaced by the 800 MHz system has been delayed until June 12, 2017.
- -The County has finalized and approved our request regarding the Cold Spring Road right of way release so that the Road Commission can construct a turn around on this dead end road which will make our winter snow removal operation on this road more efficient.
- -Summer work schedule will resume on the first week of May: Monday through Thursday 6:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until August 24^{th} .
- -Tour of South Manitou Island roads: Wagner had been contacted by National Park Service representative Lee Jameson who asked if May 24, 2017 would be a good date for the Board/staff to go to the island. Calhoun and Popa stated this date works for them and a special meeting date will be set when plans become clearer.

Set date to tour Suttons Bay and Maple City facilities:

Calhoun suggested touring the Suttons Bay garage following the May 2^{nd} regular meeting and the Maple City garage following the May 16^{th} regular meeting. Appointments:

1:05 PM: Leelanau County Undersheriff Steve Morgan and Officer Scott Robinson:

Morgan and Robinson thanked the Board for providing funds last fall so that the Sheriff's Office could purchase a new radar trailer to replace their aging and non-functional unit. Morgan reported the old unit has been repaired so that it can be used as a backup as requested by our Board, but the 2% grant request submitted to the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians for an additional unit was not granted. Popa asked if the old unit could be upgraded to which Morgan responded that it was not feasible. Robinson provided a summary of the various function the new unit is capable of performing and offered to provide a demonstration which was declined at this time pending better weather.

Communications: None.

Management Report - Wagner:

- -Maintenance: road crews have installed several right of way markers at the road ends in Leland in cooperation with Leland Township. Crews are also working on dangerous tree removals, road patching, drainage improvements on gravel roads and crack sealing is expected to begin next week.
- -Suttons Bay crew member Tom Herman retired at the end of April after over 44 years of service with the Road Commission. In addition, Suttons Bay mechanic Ardy Cassem has given his notice and left the Road Commission at the end of April. Wagner will be actively looking to replace both crew members in the weeks and months to come.
- -Union negotiations: as a preliminary meeting date of May 25th is anticipated between the union representatives and the Road Commission's bargaining team, Wagner stated that he will be seeking each board member's thoughts individually so that he has some idea what bargaining points would be feasible once the union has made their preliminary requests known.

Johnson reported that the Michigan County Road Commission Self Insurance Pool has been working on a policy to address pending requests to locate communications facilities within road right-of-ways which he will discuss later.

Nedow provided a report on our year-to-date Michigan Transportation Fund receipts which are running approximately 25% more than last year's receipts at this time and that he expects this trend to continue for the rest of the year.

Request for additional signage on Omena Point Road:

Wagner reported receiving a request from Jim Miller and Bob DeVries who asked for additional signs installed and one sign removed. The first would be at Fire Lane 5 where there is already a "watch for pedestrians" advisory sign; Miller and DeVries would like a 30 mph advisory sign added to that location. They are also requesting a "watch for pedestrians/30 mph signs be installed just west of Lake Street heading west towards Omena. Lastly, as the road will be repainted as a double yellow line (do not pass), they are asking that the 40 mph speed limit sign at the base of the hill before Fire Lane 4 be removed. The correspondence also included a diagram showing where these requested changes are located.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce directing staff to install the additional advisory signage on Omena Point Road near Fire Lane 5 and west of Lake Street as specified by Miller and DevVries, and to remove the existing 40 mph speed advisory sign at the base of the hill before Fire Lane 4. Discussion: None.

Adopting Board Rules:

No action pending Board review of the latest updated draft. Nedow directed to include this topic on the May 16th meeting agenda.

50% match for improvements to a portion of Drew Road:

Johnson reported that he had provided Empire Township with a cost estimate to upgrade a portion of Drew Road as requested last fall and that he recently learned the Township has agreed to provide funds for this project. Because the Road Commission adopted a "Upgrades to Seasonal and Unimproved Roads" policy earlier this year, Johnson would like to know if the requestors (Empire Township/land owner) would need to provide 100% of the project cost under the terms of policy or if the Board would agree to grant an exception (50% - 50% cost share) because the request to improve Drew Road was made prior to the adoption of the policy. Johnson also stated that he anticipates this project would not start until late fall due to this summer's heavy work load.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to grant an exception to the Road Commission's "Upgrades to Seasonal and Unimproved Roads" policy for a 50% cost share road improvement project for a seasonal portion of Drew Road located in Empire Township. This one-time exception is being granted because the request pre-dated the adoption of the current policy.

Managing Director's recommendation to award the bid for the Surveillance Systems Project:

Wagner reported bids for this project were opened and read on April 14, 2017 at the Road Commission office in Suttons Bay, and he has spent the past few weeks evaluating all the bids received. Of the seven proposals submitted, five excluded certain items and did not satisfy the bidding specifications. Wagner provided a written recommendation to award the \$20,755.10 bid submitted by Avonon (lower of the two remaining bids) that meet all the bid specifications, is a local firm, and has provided positive references verifying the quality of their work.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to accept the Surveillance Systems Project bid submitted by Avonon in the amount of \$20,755.10 and authorized the Managing Director to sign the bid acceptance contract. Discussion: Joyce stated he would like to have some input as to where the security cameras are to be located in both facilities.

Staff is recommending adopting this policy, drafted by the County Road Association's legal counsel. While the County Road Association (CRA) is in the process of drafting a policy/procedure of their own, Johnson is recommending adopting the policy drafted by attorney Bill Henn today. Johnson and Wagner stated their opinions that doing so would protect the Road Commission's interests while we wait for the CRA to draft a policy for the membership.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to adopt the "Permit Policy for Safely Allowing Limited Communications Service Provider Facilities Access Within the County Road Right-of-Way" and accompanying "Communications Service Provider Right-of-Way Permit – Special Terms and Conditions" as presented by staff.

Discussion: Popa suggested delaying adopting the policy in the event the CRA comes out with a similar policy: Calhoun and Joyce expressed their preference to adopt the policy as presented today which can be updated later should the CRA provide their version.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Public Comments: None.

<u>Commissioner comments</u>: Joyce: repeated his offer to assist Wagner in determining where the new security cameras should be installed.

With no more business to conduct, Calhoun recessed the meeting at 1:55 p.m. so that the Board could tour the Suttons Bay facility buildings.

Management Report - Wagner:

- -Superintendent Dave Priest is out temporarily with an injury he sustained outside of work. The rest of the administrative staff has stepped up to carry a bit more of the load. Equipment Operator Mike Mack has taken an active role in managing the field operations on the Suttons Bay side.
- -Mechanic Eric VanThomme has accepted another position and will be leaving us soon. We have extended a conditional offer of employer to a new Mechanic who has accepted and shall be starting in about two weeks.
- -Operationally, our crews have wrapped up the spring street sweeping operations. They have moved on to other spring activities including shoulder peeling, crack sealing, sign maintenance, tree removals and drainage improvements. Our crews are performing pot hole patching and crack sealing on the roads we plan to sealcoat this year and are making good progress.
- -Maple City Foreman Gino Grimaldi has been in communication with our brine supplier/contractor as we have decided to proceed with an earlier than normal mineral brine application as we did last year given the dry spring we are experiencing. Given the lack of moisture in the gravel we will need to have the water trucks pre-wet the gravel roads before the brine can be applied, adding an extra step, and cost, to the process.
- -The supervisory staff met with Russ Milan from Michigan Paving and Materials Company to conduct a preconstruction meeting regarding our sealcoating and fog sealing operations. We are going to be using a slag stone for our primary roads this year for the first time along with a different emulsion.
- -Engineer Jim Johnson has been coordinating the line painting for the first round and materials have started to arrive. Jim is also going to have our painting contractor refresh the rumble strips that we have throughout The County this year. Once our sealcoating and other paving projects are wrapped up, we will have our painting contractor return and do our second round of painting.
- -Johnson and Wagner continue to work collectively with the folks from the NRCS on the MacFarlane Road culvert replacement. Their staff has been very professional and we are very fortunate to have them working for us with this grant funded project.
- -Wagner has been working with the officials from Kasson Township as well as MDOT in looking at some safety enhancements at the M-72 x CR 667 (Maple City Rd) intersection. Kasson Township is moving forward with installing some overhead street lights to help to delineate the intersection. MDOT also installed a second set of signs alerting motorists that they are approaching a stop sign as well as a second stop sign on the opposite side of the road. We are very appreciative of the efforts provided by our project partners on these safety enhancements.
- -Our crews have experienced a number of concerning close calls with drivers not responding to our construction zone signing and flagging. In addition they have had a few encounters with uncooperative or impatient drivers. Wagner contacted The Leelanau Enterprise about this and they are interested in writing an article about this trend.
- -Work on MDOT's reconstruction project on M-22 south of M-204 started this week. Elmer's is doing the work and at the suggestion of Lee Jamison from the National Park Service (NPS) Steve Endres, the Project Manager from Elmer's has offered to donate some of the millings from their project to be placed along Kelderhouse Road which has been closed for a few years due to the impoundment of water as the result of a beaver dam.
- -Equipment Operator Joe Patterson has been busy performing work and documenting maintenance activities at the numerous lake road endings that we have throughout The County.
- -The road end marking project in Leland is going well with just a few more markers to install. It appears that the folks from Fishtown will be proceeding with some drainage improvements that have been in the works for several years now.
- -Permits of all varieties continue to pour in as new construction activity and special events heat up throughout The County. Our returning seasonal residents have also been contacting us as the number of individuals we serve swells to the peak. Virtually all of our administrative staff have been involved with these activities and assisting folks.

Engineer: Line painting should start next week per the painting contractor.

<u>Crew Leader:</u> CR 643 crack sealing should be done next week. Road end marking in Leland is wrapping up today. Crews have been busy patching roads to be sealcoated this year. Crews are working on gravel roads so that they can be brined perhaps as early as next week.

1:15 PM: Public Hearing: Request to Abandon Undeveloped, Platted Alley in Brown's Addition to the Village of Leland:

Brief overview by Wagner followed by comments provided by Attorney Peter Worden during which he related that the final version of the adjustment to the Plat includes the establishment of a utility easement where the undeveloped alley currently exists. Johnson provided an overview of the steps that would follow the public hearing today and that no action was necessary by the Board at today's public hearing. No comments were received prior to the meeting, or during the meeting from the public. Public hearing closed at 1:20.

Schedule a Special Meeting to Tour South Manitou Island Roads for May 24, 2017:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to hold a special meeting at 9:00 AM with the Board meeting at the Leland Harbor.

Discussion: The Park Service has offered to provide transportation. Wagner to procure lunch for the group.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Discuss Adopting Board Rules:

Wagner related that comments received by Popa had been incorporated into the version supplied to the Board.

Discussion ensued. Joyce stated rather than adopting Board Rules that perhaps we should be recording our meetings. He said it was unclear to him as to who would enforce how the Board Rules are to be followed. Popa stated that we have been advised by the County Road Association, as recently as the last Commissioners Conference, that we should adopt Board Rules. If we do not have them, then we should be following Robert's Rules of order and that he has been in support of them for some time. Calhoun stated that he would like the rules to address that when the majority of the Board acts on something, that the topic is over and done with and that individual members should follow the majority's decision and for that reason felt the Board Rules are good. Joyce agreed that if something is dealt with, in favor or for lack of support, it should be done with which is why recording the meetings would be beneficial. Calhoun agreed.

Nedow's motivation to do this is to take advantage of the positive market conditions and favorable return on the investment intended to further reduce the unfunded portion of our defined benefit plan.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce, to increase our monthly employer pension contribution from \$28,000 to

Joyce: Related that he thinks it was a good move to purchase the Kubota skid steer with harley rake, and that he was very impressed with Equipment Operator Calvin Wilson's ability and attitude during the execution of some work that he completed for the Village of Suttons Bay as part of our intergovernmental agreement.

Popa and Calhoun: Each expressed their gratitude to Mike Mack for stepping up in Priest's absence.

With no more business to conduct, Calhoun recessed the meeting at 1:40 p.m. so that the Board could tour the Maple City facility buildings.

Vouchers 39734 thru 39759 in the amount of \$47,745.26 - approved for payment.

Minutes from the May 16, 2017 regular session were approved as presented.

Public Comments: None.

Appointments: None.

Communications:

-Letter dated May 30, 2017 from Stephen C. Chambers of Smith Haughey Rice & Roegge Attorneys at Law, representing the Leland Country Club asking the Road Commission for relief from the Road Commission's commercial driveway standards (improvement to the entrance of Terrace Court at Pearl Street associated with the Allan McKisson driveway application). In his letter, Chambers opined that improvements McKisson is being asked to make would have a detrimental impact on the adjacent property owned by the Leland Country Club and that the additional driveway would not increase traffic on this private road. As such, Chambers is asking the Board for relief from requiring McKisson to construct a paved entrance with curb and gutter.

No action was taken on the request and Wagner was instructed to respond to Chamber's letter, informing him that his request was discussed but not granted.

Management Report - Wagner:

Staffing: Suttons Bay road crew member Windemuller and shop mechanic VanThomme have tendered their resignations. Maple City road crew member Ed Miller announced he is retiring as of August 31st and is considering coming back this winter as a seasonal night shift plow truck driver. Peter Spinniken has been hired to replace VanThomme at the Suttons Bay garage and Priest is actively looking for viable candidates for our work force.

Maintenance: first round of brining gravel roads has commenced, and the highway painting contractor is expected to start working on our roads as soon as the weather cooperates.

New contract negotiations with the union membership have started with a meeting held on May 25th. A follow up meeting is tentatively scheduled for mid-June due to scheduling conflicts between our labor attorney and the union representative.

South Manitou Island road tour: Wagner provided a separate report summarizing the inspection tour that included Board Chairman Calhoun, himself, Maple City foreman Grimaldi, National Park Service representatives Dan Ostrowski and Phil Akers and Manitou Island Transit (NPS concessionaire) representative Jimmy Munoz. Wagner noted that the high water levels on Florence Lake that flooded a section of Shefler Road have receded with minimal damage to the road bed. Other roads were visited including Floy and Ohio roads with the surfaces found to be in good shape.

Short reports were heard from Priest, Johnson and Nedow.

Discuss adopting Administrative Employee handbook:

Joyce state that he reviewed the draft and would prefer to include a new policy prohibiting alcohol and drug use while operating Road Commission equipment in the next draft. Wagner expressed no objections to the request and stated that as he is presently in contract negotiations with the union membership he recommends waiting until a new contract has been signed before presenting a revised edition to the Board to review.

Resolution 17-02: abandon undeveloped, platted alley in Brown's Addition to the Village of Leland:

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to adopt Resolution 17-02 which reads as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Leelanau has received a petition from Leland Township Supervisor Susan Och on behalf of Leland Township requesting the abandonment of an undeveloped, platted alley in Brown's Addition to the Village of Leland, and

WHEREAS, it appears to said Board of County Road Commissioners that it is in the public's best interest that this undeveloped platted alley should be absolutely abandoned and discontinued, and

WHEREAS, notification has been published in the Leelanau Enterprise and a public hearing on the Notice to Abandon was held at a regular meeting of the Board of County Road Commissioners on May 16, 2017, and

WHEREAS, the abandonment of this undeveloped, platted alley will not land-lock any parcel of land, all parcels with frontage along this road have adequate access by alternate means, and no objections, either written or verbal objections have been voiced by any adjacent property owners over the proposed abandonment, and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following describes the undeveloped, platted alley more fully as: The Alley located in Block 1 of Brown's Addition to the Village of Leland, according to the plat thereof as recorded in Miscellaneous Liber 1, Page 418, revised in Liber 10, Page 457, Leelanau County records, all located in Leland Township, be and the same is absolutely abandoned and discontinued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a record of this abandonment is to be recorded with the Register of Deeds and a legal notice of abandonment is to be published in the Leelanau Enterprise.

Roll call vote: Joyce - Aye; Popa - Aye; Calhoun - Aye. Nays: None.

Clarify recording meetings:

At the last Road Commission meeting, a motion to adopt Board rules was adopted including a provision (as offered by Joyce) for audio recording future Board meetings. Wagner asked Joyce to clarify this provision as it pertains what to do with the audio recordings after the meeting before any funds are spent on recording equipment. Joyce stated that he would like to see the recordings posted on the Road Commission's website similar to what Leelanau County does so that those who cannot attend Road Commission meetings can listen to them online.

Nedow stated he discussed recording meetings with the Road Commission's labor attorney who advised that the recordings, which are FOIA discoverable, could be a potential risk and should be destroyed as soon as that meeting minutes are approved. He also stated no other road commissions post their meeting recordings on the web but several metropolitan county Boards (including Grand Traverse County) televise their meetings on public access television.

Calhoun and Popa expressed their viewpoints that they are agreeable to recording the meetings to assist Nedow in preparing the meeting minutes but agreed that the recordings be destroyed after the meeting minutes have been approved. Joyce disagreed, stating his opinion that the Board should not limit itself to what other road agencies are doing and he does not see the harm in posting the recordings online. Calhoun then stated he would be willing to discuss the matter further at a later date.

Resolution 17-03: annual engineering reimbursement request to MDOT:

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to adopt Resolution 17-03 which reads as follows:

"We, the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County, do hereby request reimbursement in the amount of \$10,000 for payments made during the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 to licensed professional engineers employed or retained by this Commission, in accordance with the following: Sec. 12(2) of Act 51, as amended. "Each county road commission shall be reimbursed in an amount up to \$10,000 per year for the sum paid to a licensed professional engineer employed or retained by the county road commission in the previous year.

The sum shall be returned to each county road commission certified by the state transportation department as complying with this subsection regarding the employment of an engineer. We further state that if we do not have a licensed professional engineer in our employ, copies of billings are enclosed with the completed form to justify the payment."

Public Comments: None.

Appointments: At 1:05 p.m. the Board met with Jim Nairne and Lynn Sugarman who requested possible alternative options to the Road Commission's commercial driveway standards for upgrading the Onominese Trail entrance. Nairne had already provided escrow funds as required by the Road Commission's commercial driveway standards and said that he intends to comply with them. However, before proceeding with construction, he informed the Board that he would like to hire a consultant to come up with an alternative design utilizing other types of building materials that he feels would blend in better with the surrounding rural terrain. Before proceeding, he is asking the Board and staff if the Road Commission would consider allowing him to use other materials provided the design would be able to satisfy the Road Commission's construction requirements. Should the alternative concept not meet staff's approval, Nairne stated he would comply with building the improvements as directed on his originally approved commercial driveway permit.

After further discussion, the Board stated that they while they are not in favor of granting an exception to our commercial driveway standards, they would be willing to consider allowing Nairne to use other types of building materials to construct the improvements provided staff is satisfied that the design meets our commercial driveway standards.

Communications:

-Letter dated June 6, 2017 from the Michigan County Road Commission Self Insurance Pool asking the Board to cast votes on two ballots for the 2017 Board of Directors' Election: the first for two Northern positions, and the second for two At-Large positions.

Staff offered their recommendation to support Cooper and Gutowski who they believe have served the Pool well in the past.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to vote for incumbents Alan Cooper – Wexford County and Brian Gutowski – Emmet County for the MCRCSIP Board of Directors' Northern positions (both three year term ending 2020).

-Letter dated May 30, 2017 from Bingham Township Supervisor Midge Werner thanking the Road Commission for allowing Bingham and Suttons Bay Townships to host their annual Clean-up Day at the Suttons Bay facility.

Management Report - Wagner:

Projects/maintenance: Work crews have been completing a lot of small projects such as culvert replacements and cleaning ditches. Our emulsion supplier is having quality issues with the emulsion blend that we intend to use for seal coating secondary/local roads. While our supplier continues to work on resolving their quality problems, the seal coat crew is concentrating on the primary road system using a different grade of emulsion with improved properties. A new type of slag stone is also being applied to primary roads for the first time with favorable results reported so far.

The surveillance system vendor has completed the installation at the Maple City garage. The Suttons Bay surveillance system installation is expected to be finished by the end of the week.

Collective bargaining negotiations: Follow up meeting is scheduled for June 22nd when our labor attorney will present a draft agreement in response to the changes requested by the union stewards and their business representative.

Reports were offered by Johnson and Priest.

Contract modification: add additional projects to 2017 asphalt pavement contract:

Wagner is recommending increasing the scope of several paving projects to take advantage of favorable asphalt, emulsion prices; higher than anticipated MTF revenues and higher than anticipated proceeds from the sale of surplus equipment. These projects are:

- CR-641 pavement overlay from Bingham Road north approximately 1,000 feet.
- CR-614 shoulder widening and pavement overlay from Perrins Landing to Lincoln Road approximately 1.5 miles.
- CR-616 pavement wedging and overlay from Cedar west near Novak Road, approximately 1.0 miles.
- Cold Spring Road pave the cul-de-sac.
- Timberlee Court pavement overlay approximately 380 feet.

The notice to bidders – bid description include a statement informing the bidders that the Road Commission reserves the right to change quantities on projects. Wagner also provided a copy of a letter dated June 14, 2017 from Team Elmers accepting the offer to extend their contract prices for additional paving projects.

Motion by Joyce supported by Popa to accept Team Elmer's offer to extend their 2017 paving contract pricing for additional paving projects as doing so would be in the best interests of the Leelanau County Road Commission.

Management Report - Wagner:

Projects/maintenance: With crew members consumed by the sealcoat operation, it has been a challenge to respond to routine maintenance calls. To compensate, crews are working Fridays on projects that could not be done during the work week.

Wagner received word that MDOT has applied for a more substantial project on M-22 that would pick up where the Dumas Road intersection was reconstructed last year and extend north beyond the Setterbo Road intersection. With funds being tight, he stated that it is more likely this project will be included in MDOT's five-year plan and possibly included should funds be secured.

A work crew has returned from South Manitou Island recently where they spend two days working on Shefler Road and removing brush from one island road. Wagner has contacted the National Park Service to inquire about the possibility of sending another crew to the island this fall to continue removing brush from other island roads.

The surveillance system installation at Suttons Bay has been completed. Wagner has also contracted with the vendor to install a large screen monitor with articulating arm in the Suttons Bay meeting room which could be used during meetings as well as a training resource.

Status updates were offered by Priest, Grimaldi, Johnson and Nedow. Priest and Grimaldi stated their opinions that the slag rock being used to sealcoat primary roads is yielding positive results.

Approve new labor agreement:

The Board met with the Road Commission's legal counsel (Tom Derderian of Michael Kluck and Associates) who presented a new three year labor agreement ratified by the union membership on July 10, 2017. The new agreement, effective July 10, 2017 to June 30 2020 includes the following provisions:

- Road Commission agreed to deduct Union dues from paychecks;
- Simplified grievance process;
- Removed provision that seniority will govern who gets called for emergency overtime work;
- Streamlined how Funeral Leave is applied;
- Changed the notification period for vacation requests from 30 working days to 30 calendar days;
- Added the Friday after Thanksgiving as a paid holiday;
- Adopted the State of Michigan Public Act 152 of 2011 health insurance premium caps;
- Clarified that the administrative staff shall pick the health care provider;
- Union members involved in a vehicular accident may be subject to drug and alcohol testing;
- LCRC will pay for employees CDL/DOT physical by approved qualified DOT physician;
- Included hi visibility work wear and safety boot policies in the contract;
- 2.5% wage increase for 2017; a 2.0% increase for 2018 and a 2.0% increase for 2019.
- Premium pay associates assigned to work in the garage eight hours or more: raise to \$0.50 per hour;
- Premium pay rate increase to \$1.00 per hour for equipment operators assigned to certain equipment;
- Add operating chainsaws, roadside mowing and skid steer and remove roller and compactor from list of equipment eligible for premium pay;
- Added provision that if a mechanic achieves and maintains State certification in any of the following areas, they will receive a \$0.25 per hour increase for each area of certification:
 - Heavy Duty Trucks Electrical Systems
 - o Heavy Duty Trucks Suspension & Steering Systems

 - Heavy Duty Trucks Drive Train SystemsHeavy Duty Trucks Brakes & Braking Systems

Derderian stated that given the recent increase in funding and to enhance the Road Commission's ability to compete with the private sector to hire employees, it is his opinion that the package negotiated is fair and

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce authorizing the Board to sign a new three-year collective bargaining agreement dated July 11, 2017 between the Road Commission and Teamsters Local 214 which will expire on June 30, 2020.

Management Report - Wagner:

-As this year's seal coat operation draws to an end, efforts will shift the to the reconstructions projects on CR-614 and CR-641. MDOT has approved a transportation work authorization for up to \$25,000.00 for skip paving on M-22 through Omena as well as one for the same amount at the switchback on M-22 near Setterbo Road.

-Three employees will be leaving the Road Commission in the next few weeks. Maple City employees Ed Miller and Charles Eldred will be retiring while Suttons Bay employee Zachary Zywicki will be leaving to pursue a higher education. Also, a Suttons Bay employee will be retiring in January 2018. Wagner reported one new employee will be starting on August 21st while two other candidates have accepted our job offers to start in early September.

-Status of proposed "new" road projects: Wagner stated that staff held a meeting to determine if there are sufficient funds available for all additional projects planned. While enough funding is forecasted to allow Wagner to commit to most of the projects (Cold Spring Road cul-de-sac; Lake Street in Leland; Timberlee Court; CR-641 extend present project south 1,000 feet; and CR 614 extend present project westerly 6,900 feet), it is not clear that adequate funding exists for CR-616 west of Cedar. The decision to either commit to this project this fall or postpone it until next summer will be made in September as soon as there are any clear indications that the necessary funds will be available. Nedow stated that should this project be postponed until next year, there is a contingency plan in place to move ahead planned 2018 capital purchases into this year.

Status updates were offered by Priest, Grimaldi, Albrecht and Nedow. Johnson provided a draft resolution which he is planning to share with the Paul Bunyan Council offering a proposal for MDOT to "buy-out" Federal Rural STP funding while allowing MDOT to keep Economic Development "D" funds to provide them with a source to match funds for projects with Federal STP funding.

Execute agreement: Road improvements within Village of Empire:

Motion by Popa, supported by Calhoun to execute an agreement between the Leelanau County Road Commission and the Village of Empire for the following road improvements on Aylsworth and Washington Streets: provide labor, equipment and materials to place over-band crack sealant on larger, visible cracks; followed by placement of a single chip-seal over the existing streets using CRS-2M asphalt emulsion and 31A natural aggregate, followed by a fog seal with Fasblack emulsion. Work to include sweeping before seal-coat application and again before fog seal is applied. Village personnel to provide adequate traffic control. The Village hereby agrees to reimburse the Road Commission for the entire cost of work performed on a time and material basis with an estimated cost of \$12,750.00. Payment is due upon completion of the work on or around September 1, 2017.

- -Our crews have completed this year's sealcoat and fog seal operation, completing approximately 46 miles of primary and secondary roads. Work is underway on CR-614 where we will be repaving, making drainage and shoulder improvements from Bugai Road to Lincoln Road. As the wedging course used less material than estimated, the remaining tonnage was used to wedge a portion (east end) of Lincoln Road.
- -Timberlee Court has been paved. Utility relocation work is underway at CR-641 prior to our crews starting work on reconstructing a portion of this road (between Bingham and Donner Roads). Progress will be dependent upon weather and available manpower. Crew members have also completed road improvements (crack filling, sealcoating and fog sealing) for two Village of Empire streets, with the Village reimbursing the Road Commission for all of the associated costs.
- -Wagner reported receiving notice from MDOT that their M-22 joint replacement project (M-22 south of Suttons Bay) has been delayed until after September 18, 2017.
- -New employees: Randy Neindorf started August 21st and Philip Packard September 5th at the Suttons Bay garage.

Popa asked Johnson about the status of a draft resolution he introduced at the last Paul Bunyan meeting suggesting MDOT would "buy-out" Federal Rural STP funding while keeping Economic Development "D" funds which MDOT could use as a source to match funds for projects with Federal STP funding. Bid results: MDOT transportation work authorization projects:

Wagner reported that the bid proposals he received for two MDOT projects (budgeted for \$25,000.00 each) are significantly higher than the estimates. While MDOT representatives are contemplating whether or not to proceed, Wagner was asked to contact the contractors who submitted proposals to see if reducing the scope of the projects would help reduce the quotations. Management Report - Wagner:

- -Elmer's is scheduled to continue paving on CR-614 this week. The utility relocation work required for the CR-641 project has taken the utility companies longer than anticipated, but Wagner is confident work should be completed before the weather turns bad.
- -Efforts to enlist the cooperation of the contractors who bid on the MDOT transportation work authorization projects to explore reducing the scope of the work to the amount of budgeted funds available was not successful. MDOT hopes to revisit these two projects next construction season provided there are funds available.
- -New crew member Randy Thom started on September 11^{th} . Wagner reported extending a job offer to another qualified candidate which was accepted pending pre-employment screening results.
- -A MDEQ permit to replace the culverts under Kabat Road has been obtained. Due to our current workload and pavement contractors already at maximum capacity, this project will be postponed until next year. The condition of the culvert does not appear to be worsening so this delay should not cause any issues.
- -Wagner provided a brief report on topics discussed during the annual North/South County Road Association joint conference held recently at Boyne Mountain Resort. He reported the Leelanau County Road Commission had once again received recognition from the County Road Association Self Insurance Fund Workers' Compensation Loss Prevention for achieving an experience modification factor of less than 1.0.

Johnson reported on a recommendation by the County Road Association's Permits Subcommittee and the Paul Bunyan Council for all road commissions to adopt a uniform permit fee schedule as proposed by the East Central Council. Wagner wanted the Board to be aware of the initiative as a public hearing would be required and scheduled to consider the proposal. After further discussion, the Board asked Wagner to create a spreadsheet for their next meeting that depicts what the proposed uniform fees would be in comparison to our current fee schedule.

Nedow reported on receiving a \$76,015.00 refund from the Michigan County Road Association Self-Insurance Pool who distributed excess funds from lower than expected settlement costs from prior years. The Road Commission also received a check for \$59,094.00 from a third-party auction house for the sale of surplus road equipment. Request for soliciting bids for providing and installing a gasoline tank with dispenser at Maple City have gone out, and efforts to analyze various health insurance options is underway which will culminate with a recommendation to the Board later this fall.

Bids - McFarlane Road/Hatlem Creek culvert replacement project:

Wagner reported receiving the following bids earlier that morning: Elmers - \$149,678.34; Molon Excavating - \$214,760.00; and DJ McQuestion and Sons - \$217,816.00.

Wagner stated the bids received were higher than the NRCS estimate for the project. Wagner explained that this could be due to the area contractors being busy, or that the estimate was simply a bit low. The options would be to proceed as planned, try and negotiate a lower price with the low bidder with a modified work scope, or re-bid the work for the following year. He explained that if the project is re-bid, this could result in an increase in cost over the bids that had been received. Furthermore, the MDEQ permit for the project has time limitations for work in the spring to avoid conflicting with fish spawning activities that could push the project into the busy summer months. Delaying the project would also jeopardize one of the two grants the NRCS obtained which was paying for a significant portion of the project.

Wagner then asked the Board for their input. Nedow stated that while no funds had been budgeted for this project, there are sufficient funds available to cover the unanticipated overages related to this project. Joyce, Popa and Calhoun expressed their desires to proceed with the project this fall and that they would be comfortable awarding the bid to the lowest bidder, Elmer's.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to award the bid for the McFarlane Road/Hatlem Creek culvert replacement project to Elmer's as doing so would be in the best interests of the Leelanau County Road Commission.

Management Report - Wagner:

-Elmer's is scheduled to complete paving CR-614 next week, and work is proceeding on CR-641 project. Wagner also concluded his post bid interview with Elmer's and has sent them a draft contract to sign for the McFarlane Road/Hatlem Creek culvert replacement project. A preconstruction meeting has been scheduled for next week.

-Wagner reported an ongoing issue for over a year with a property owner who installed some unpermitted and illegal fences in the right of way of Glen Eden Drive in Glen Arbor Township. The fences were installed near the road edge along the frontage of two properties they own along this road. Extensive efforts to work with the property owners to get them into compliance and relocate the fences have been unsuccessful. While there were initial indications that the property owners would comply, they have since continued to evade any follow through and more recently involved an attorney. Repeated contacts to the attorney have not been returned and Wagner recently sent a certified letter informing the temporary owners that our crew would be removing their fences as allowed by State law. This prompted a response from the attorney who relayed his viewpoint that we do not have the right to follow through on this. Wagner also stated that Leelanau County Prosecuting Attorney Hubble has been made aware of what has transpired along with our plans to remove the fences. The Board agreed and authorized Wagner to proceed with removal.

- -Wagner provided a copy of the presentation he made to the County Board of Commissioners earlier in the day.
- -Follow up: recommendation by the County Road Association's Permits Subcommittee and the Paul Bunyan Council for all road commissions to adopt a uniform permit fee schedule:

Staff provided a handout that depicted our current permit fee schedule and included the proposed uniform permit fees alongside each corresponding category. Explanative captions were also included whenever the there were differences in the amounts.

Joyce stated his preference to adopt the fees as recommended and suggested including stipulations that would enable staff the ability to charge more in the event additional costs are incurred when processing a special event permit request. Popa agreed with Joyce, stating his opinion that should the Board decide not to comply, he does not want the Road Commission to be criticized for non-conforming to the request.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to schedule a public hearing on Tuesday, November 21, 2017 starting at 1:15 p.m. so that the Board can hear public comments pertaining to the Road Commission adopting a uniform permit fee schedule as proposed by the County Road Association's Permits Subcommittee and the Paul Bunyan Council.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Bid results: 2,000 gallon gasoline tank/dispenser at Maple City garage:

Bids were opened and read earlier in the day, with the results as follows:

R.W. Mercer = \$49,975.00; Oscar Larson = \$51,471.00 and Rohr Gasoline Equipment = \$53,661.96

Nedow provided a written recommendation to accept the lowest bid submitted by Mercer. As it will take several weeks the storage vessel and skid system to be manufactured, the contractor will proceed with installing the concrete slab and running the underground electric and tank monitoring lines and upgrading the electrical service panel within the building to accommodate the new circuitry.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to accept the R. W. Mercer Company bid of \$49,975.00 for providing/installing a 2,000 gallon gasoline fuel tank/dispenser system at our Maple City facility as doing so would be in the best interests of the Leelanau County Road Commission.

Also, to amend the 2017 Road Commission budget by increasing Expenditures: Capital Acquisitions by \$50,000.00 in recognition of the new fuel system.

Resolution 17-07: authorize sale of 2019 rural STP funds to the Road Commission of Oakland County:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to adopt Resolution 17-07 which reads as follows:

WHEREAS, county road agencies may transfer federal highway aid available to them to other county road agencies for certain purposes subject to approval by the Michigan Department of Transportation ("MDOT") and Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA"). 23 U.S.C. 126; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Leelanau") has determined that it is in its best interest to transfer available federal aid funds in exchange for non-federal transportation dollars to enable the most efficient use of dollars and cost effective performance of improvements to its county road system; and

WHEREAS, Leelanau has identified The Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Oakland ("Oakland") as a county road agency interested in purchasing the federal aid funds; and

WHEREAS, Leelanau would agree to set the rate of exchange at \$0.75 of non-federal transportation funds for each \$1.00 of STP funds; and

WHEREAS, Leelanau desires to transfer an estimated \$600,000 of STP funds available to it in fiscal year 2019 and identified on its Local TIP as "Federal Fund Exchange", in exchange for non-federal transportation dollars from Oakland; and

WHEREAS, county road agencies in Michigan are authorized to enter into voluntary exchange agreements with other local road agencies for the purpose of exchanging federal aid funds with state transportation dollars pursuant to Section 402 of Public Act 252 of 2014;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Leelanau, by adoption of this resolution, may proceed and develop an agreement with Oakland that would allow for said exchange to occur.

Roll call vote: Joyce - Aye; Popa - Aye; Calhoun - Aye. Nays: None. Resolution is hereby adopted.

Consideration: agreement with DTE for improving Roubal Road:

In a separate email sent to the Board on September 21st, Wagner had reported that the subcontractor hired by DTE to install natural gas lines in the Peshawbestown area had, in fact installed the lines outside of the locations authorized in the authorizing permit, nor were these lines being directionally drilled also required per the permit. Some lines were buried adjacent to Roubal Road quite close to the road. had discovered this situation, he shut their job down and subsequently set up a meeting with representatives from DTE. Two alternatives to rectify the situation were discussed, with DTE agreeing to provide us with a check that would cover half the cost to overlay the stretch of Roubal Road (approximately 2,750 feet in length) where the lines had been incorrectly installed. Johnson estimated their share of the project to be \$25,000.00 with the project being done next year. Wagner is asking the Board to approve the agreement and to authorize the Managing Director to sign it on their behalf.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa authorizing the Managing Director to sign an agreement with DTE whereby DTE agrees to pay the Road Commission \$25,000.00 by January 31, 2018 toward repaving a 2,750 foot segment of Roubal Road during fiscal year 2018 where DTE had incorrectly installed gas lines. The Road Commission agrees that this will bring closure to this issue and will not seek subsequent damages from DTE in connection with the Permit and the Road.

Another option would be to call for a recess with a pre-determined explanation that could be given so Board members could get up and get out of the Board room if the situation is perceived as unsafe.

Wagner stated he will continue his efforts on other older topics discussed including; creating a travel policy, 2018 budget items, emergency operations, joint meeting with Road Commission Board/staff and National Park Service Staff, drafting an escrow policy, long term plans for capital improvements and updating the proposed administrative employee handbook.

Management Report - Wagner:

- -Projects: work is proceeding on the CR-641 project as crew have completed the mass earth grading and have moved onto working on the final grade. We continue to wait for the asphalt contractor to pave the top course on the CR-614 project. Elmers has mobilized this week for the CR-616/Hatlem Creek culvert project.
- -Staffing: Maple City crew member Charles Eldred retired on October 13th and Suttons Bay mechanic Pete Spinniken is leaving for other employment at the end of the week. Nate Yansksa joined the Suttons Bay road crew on October 9th. Wagner and Priest will continue to search for one or two more candidates provided they possess the right skills and aptitude.

Johnson

Johnson updated the Board on a recent meeting that Dan Wagner had scheduled with Jason Stowe, Superintendent of Leland Public Schools and Dave Priest. Stowe outlined several traffic and parking issues around the school that have developed as the student population has grown over the last 15 years. School and Road Commission staff will be working on possible solutions to these issues to improve safety for student drop off, bus traffic and students walking to school. These solutions might include designating a one-way street and restricting or prohibiting parking in certain areas. Further updates will be provided after the situation is fully evaluated.

The Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians has applied for a permit to install over 20 miles of buried fiber optic line in the right of way of several county roads. Their intent is to connect their facilities in Peshawbestown with other locations outside of Leelanau County by running a fiber optic line southerly to the intersection of Bugai Road and M-72, where it would cross into Grand Traverse County. While public utility installation in county road right of way is authorized by MCL 247.184 for those utilities recognized by the State of Michigan Public Service Commission, the GTB does not currently have that designation. Since there are similarities between the status of the GTB and Community Service Providers we are attempting to use the model documents recently provided by MCRCSIP and CRA as a means of enabling the Road Commission to issue permits. We have forwarded information to our attorney for guidance and expect a response back from him shortly.

Nedow:

Provided interim quarterly financial reports posted through September 30, 2017.

Recommendation: implement new heath insurance carrier/plans effective December 1, 2017:

Wagner and Nedow provided a report to the Board outlining their recommendation. The current pre-Affordable Care Act health plans with Priority Health are due to renew on December 1, 2017 and as expected, monthly premiums for both plans will be increasing in excess of 4.0%. Working with our local insurance agent Barry Riske, Nedow reviewed over twenty-five different options to search for the best affordable coverage within our funding restrictions (Public Act 152 of 2011 – annual limits on what the Road Commission can spend on health insurance).

Nedow further explained that due to the number of participants, the maximum number of plans we could offer is two. And this year, Blue Care Network is quoting health care premiums that are competitive with Priority Health. He also explained that if the decision was made to discontinue either current plan, we would be required to change both policies to ACA compliant plans.

After discussing several options, the administrative staff reached a consensus to ask the Board to discontinue both Priority Health plans and instead offer two Blue Care Network ACA compliant options; a HMO-HSA Silver plan, and a HMO-HSA Gold plan. Employees can choose either plan, whichever one best meets their needs. As the "Silver" option has a higher deductible than the "Gold" plan, this option maximizes how much money the Road Commission could pay into each participating employee's Heath Savings Account annually. Staff agrees both options are a better bargain than the Priority Health plans we presently have. A comparative spreadsheet was provided that depicts the annual health savings account funding by classification as well as employee financial exposure for deductibles and maximum out of pocket costs that is essentially a "best case-worst case" viewpoint. Because the recently ratified union agreement states the Board chooses the health care insurance carrier and plan(s), Nedow asked the Board to accept the administrative staff's recommendation.

Motion by Joyce; supported by Popa to authorize staff to change health care insurance providers by enrolling in Blue Care Network and offer two plans to the bargaining unit and to the administrative staff: ACA compliant HMO-HSA Silver and ACA compliant HMO-HSA Gold plans effective December 1, 2017. Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion is approved.

Nedow then stated handouts and other literature would be distributed this week to the workforce along with paychecks. In addition, informative meetings have been set up at each garage early next week with our health insurance agent to answer any questions. Enrollment forms need to be turned into our agent no later than November 1, 2017.

Management Report - Wagner:

- -Projects: paving has been completed on CR-614 and CR-641, with CR-641 re-opening to traffic this week. Crews have almost completed shoulder restoration work at both sites. In order to install guard rail at both locations, intermittent lane closures are anticipated during this process. At the CR-616/Hatlem Creek culvert replacement project, Elmers is currently working on the engineering backfill surrounding the culvert, the headwalls and installing the required material in the culvert to simulate the stream bottom. They expected to complete this project by November 10, 2017.
- -Staffing: Wagner reported making offers to two candidates; one for a mechanic and one for an equipment operator which were accepted. He also expressed his appreciation to those crew members who helped out in the Suttons Bay shop these past few weeks.
- -Reported that due to the increase in people building driveways in violation of the terms and the conditions of the permit (and many who have not applied for a permit), Wagner has been exploring ways to improve compliance. The attorney Wagner had contacted to discuss possible courses of action is recommending we be aggressive in enforcing the terms and conditions of our permits. If the Road Commission finds work being done that violates our permit requirements, then swift corrective action should be taken. The attorney also pointed out that it will be imperative that the Board back Staff up for those who come before them seeking relief.

Also, efforts to enlist the support of the County Construction Codes Authority to ensure compliance to our permit requirements were not successful. Wagner had a conversation with Department head Haugen who believes he lacks the authority to mandate compliance unless granted by the County Board of Commissioners.

Johnson:

- -Has provided the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa & Chippewa Indians with the language for a draft governmental utility permit for installing fiber optic cable within the right of way on several county roads. The Road Commission's attorney has opined that the Road Commission does have the authority to issue a permit and that the Grand Traverse Band is recognized by the State of Michigan as a qualifying governmental agency.
- -Provided details for a pilot program for issuing transportation permit. Leelanau and Washtenaw County Road Commissions have agreed to be test subjects for this program. Permit applicants would need to submit their request and associated fees to Oxcart, a private company who in turn forward the application to the Road Commission for review and approval. Fees are collected from the applicants by Oxcart. Johnson and Nedow expressed their support for this process.

Priest:

-Once shoulder restoration work has been completed on CR-614 and CR-641 projects, crew members will be marking their plow routes.

Nedow:

Reported attending a recent Northern Michigan Finance and Human Resource Committee meeting where the Open Meetings Act was the topic of discussion. The program presenter, Wendy Hardt of Michael Kluck and Associates offered suggestions how to help prevent violations where it pertains to exchanging e-mails between Board members. Hardt suggested that Board Secretaries and staff should get in the habit of sending electronic correspondence to each member separately as a means of discouraging dialog between commissioners. She also suggested staff members should not be intermediaries for discussions between Board members which could be interpreted as circumventing the Act.

Resolution 17-07: amendment to current MDOT Trunkline maintenance contract:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to adopt Resolution 17-07 which reads as follows:

WHEREAS, the Michigan Department of Transportation ("MDOT") has presented a contract amendment between MDOT and the Leelanau County Road Commission under which the Road Commission would perform maintenance on state trunk-line highways within Leelanau County, and

WHEREAS, The CONTRACT provides for MDOT and the Leelanau County Road Commission to mutually agree to work together to improve maintenance activities on the state Trunkline system; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the CONTRACT to provide for a change in State Administrative Board (SAB) requirements per State of Michigan Administrative Board Resolution 2017-2 of April 25, 2017;

WHEREAS, both parties desire to correct a paragraph in Section 15 of the CONTRACT was incorrectly indented;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Leelanau County Road Commission and MDOT agree that in order to set forth the change in SAB requirements, Section 9.B. and 26 of the CONTRACT (2017-0176/A1) are amended the following sections to read as follows:

- -Section 9. SUBCONTRACTS: B. Subcontracts \$25,000.00 or greater: The Board will advertise and award by competitive bid. Advertisements must clearly define contract term and location of work. Documentation of the solicitation from all qualified sources must be retained. Region Engineer approval of Form 426 is required. State Administrative Board approval is required on contracts that are \$500,000 or greater.
- -Section 26. STATE OF MICHIGAN ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD RESOLUTION: The provisions of the State of Michigan Administrative Board Resolution 2017-2 of April 25, 2017, are set forth in Appendix F, attached hereto and made a part of hereof
- -In order to set forth the change in SAB requirements, Appendix F is replaced with Revised Appendix F, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and Appendix I is replaced with Revised Appendix I, attached hereto and made part hereof.
- -The following paragraph within Section 15.F of the CONTRACT was incorrectly indented and should be aligned with the paragraph below it.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that all other provisions of the CONTRACT, except as herein amended, remain in full force and effect as originally set forth, and that the Leelanau County Road Commission Board waives any and all claims it has or may have against MDOT that arise out of the need to amend the CONTRACT.

Management Report - Wagner:

Projects: At CR-641 and CR-614 projects, crews have finished shoulder restoration and the paint and guard rail contractors have finished their work. All that remains of the CR-616/Hatlem Creek culvert project is for the contractor to finish installing the straw matting on the earthen embankments.

New employee David Boynton recently started at the Suttons Bay garage and a new mechanic is expected to start on November 27th. Priest has already started the early night patrol shift with the later shift staring at the end of the month, depending on the weather.

Priest:

-Plow routes have been marked and crews have already had to plow snow a few times in recent days.

Nedow:

- -Reported preliminary concrete and wiring has been completed at the Maple City garage for the new gasoline vessel/dispenser, which is expected to be delivered in early December.
- -State of Michigan-Commission Audit has completed their audit of our State Maintenance Trunkline billings that were submitted to MDOT for 2016 MDOT fiscal year. The Road Commission expecting to receive a \$107,148.00 refund as our audited actual expenses for maintaining the Trunkline routes were more than what was billed to MDOT. Also, restricting newer plow trucks to Trunkline activities have aided our efforts for MDOT to participate at a higher percentage in the cost reimbursement for new trucks.
- -With the millage due to be renewed next August, Nedow stated the Board will need to review the 2018 ballot language so that Wagner can asked the County Board of Commissioners to approve placing the renewal on the August 2018 primary ballot. Wagner suggested the Board may wish to consider changing the length of the millage request for something longer than two years.
- -Reported that the Leelanau County Board of Commissioners Executive Board has voted to forward two resolutions. The first resolution is to change the Road Commission Board membership from three members to five. The second is to change the Road Commissioner compensation from \$2,500.00 per year with health insurance benefits to \$6,000.00 per year with no health insurance benefits. Vehicle mileage reimbursement will remain at the current approved IRS rate and per diem payments will change to the County Board's payment amounts. If approved at the November 21st regular County Board of Commissioner's meeting both resolutions would go into effect on January 1, 2019.

Public hearing: proposed permit fee schedule:

Calhoun recessed the regular session and opened the public hearing at 1:15 p.m. The purpose of the public hearing is to listen to oral and written comments regarding the Road Commission board adopting a uniform permit fee schedule.

Johnson provided a summary of events that culminated in the new permit fee schedule that the County Road Association of Michigan is recommending the membership to adopt.

No comments, written or oral were offered. Calhoun adjourned the hearing at 1:23 p.m. and returned to open session.

Commissioner comments regarding the proposal:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to authorize the Manger to accept Beckman Production Services offer to extend their 2017 pricing for brine to 2018.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to authorize the Manager to accept Bayshore Oil and Propane's offer to extend 2017 pricing for gasoline and diesel fuel to 2018.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Road Commission membership on Leelanau County Parks & Recreation Commission:

As the Road Commission's representative on the Leelanau County – Parks & Recreation Commission, Popa stated he does not have the time to continue in that capacity and asked if either Joyce or Calhoun would be willing to replace him. Calhoun and Joyce stated they would prefer to wait until January to discuss Popa's request.

Request to adjust the 2017 Road Commission budget:

Nedow provided a list of year-end budget adjustments for the Board to review which he reviewed with the Board.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to adjust the 2017 Road Commission Revenues and Expenditures Budget as follows:

Expenditures:

Increase Primary Road-Heavy Maintenance - \$220,000.00; Local Road-Routine Maintenance - \$250,000.00; State Trunkline-TWA - \$5,000.00; Fringe Benefits - \$250,000.00; decrease Local Road-Heavy Maintenance \$50,000.00; State Trunkline - Routine Maintenance - \$50,000.00; and Capital Outlay \$50,000.00. A regular meeting of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County was called to order by Chairman Jim Calhoun at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 5, 2017 at 10550 E. Eckerle Road, Suttons Bay, Michigan. Present: Chairman Jim Calhoun, Vice-chairman John Popa, Member Robert Joyce, Managing Director Dan Wagner, Engineer James C. Johnson, Superintendent Dave Priest and Finance Manager/Secretary to the Board Joe Nedow. Guests were present.

Agenda: Approved as presented.

Vouchers 40261 thru 40287 in the amount of \$60,364.58 - approved for payment.

Minutes from the November 21, 2017 regular meeting - approved as presented.

<u>Public Comments:</u> Heard comments from Kirk Eckerle, manager of Stoney Point Orchards about a letter from the Road Commission regarding fencing installed within the Davis Road/Putnam Road intersection right of way and damaged signs. Wagner suggested to the Board that the time reserved for "Public Comments" is not the venue to have a dialog on this matter. He suggested Eckerle could make an appointment with the Board for a later date. Calhoun agreed, stating that Eckerle could contact the Road Commission and schedule a meeting time for a future date.

Communications: None.

Management Report - Wagner:

Projects: Wagner reported all pending paving projects have been completed. He complimented Priest, Grimaldi and the crew, stating they did a great job pulling everything together. As for the 2018 CR-669 culvert replacement project, Wagner announced that the Road Commission received notice that our application for the FLAP grant has been approved. The budget that accompanied the application includes a \$125,000 match from Cleveland Township; \$125,000 from us, and \$225,000 in grant funding for a total estimated project cost of \$475,000. He hopes to have this project completed in the 2018 construction season if all goes well.

New employee Richard Blodgette started Monday as a mechanic at the Suttons Bay garage. This year's season roster includes newly retired employee Ed Miller as well as returning seasonal workers Mike Zeits, Mark Noonan, Brian Weber, Mark Walters along with two other possible backup drivers.

Wagner also provided the latest draft revision to the Administrative Employee Handbook for the Board to review and consider adopting at their next meeting.

<u>Appointments</u>: At 1:15 p.m. Calhoun recessed the regular meeting and opened the public hearing. The purpose of the hearing is to hear public comments related to the proposed 2018 Road Commission budget.

Nedow provided a summary of how the various revenues and expenditure line items were calculated. He explained that the forecast provided by MDOT for Michigan Transportation Funds revenues will continue to increase for the next several years. However, his observation is this year's MTF receipts have already exceeded MDOT's forecast so the budget was prepared with higher revenues than MDOT forecasted for 2018. Along with higher millage proceeds, the additional funds are budgeted to flow into the County's road system, thru an expanded seal coat program (same miles, include slag aggregate and better quality emulsion on local roads) and more funds earmarked for paving projects.

No comments, oral or written, were offered either in favor or opposed to the draft budget.

Calhoun then closed the public hearing at 1:30 p.m. and reconvened the regular meeting.

Popa asked several questions about the budget and Nedow stated he would ask the Board to formally adopt the budget (by resolution) at the next meeting.

The Board heard reports from Priest, Johnson and Nedow.

Request to revise "Policy on the Installation of Public & Private Utilities in the County ROW":

Johnson explained that when the Board adopted the new uniform permit fee schedule that includes charging fees for utility permits, the "Policy on the Installation of Public & Private Utilities in the County ROW" should also have been updated to reflect this change.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to update the "Policy on the Installation of Public & Private Utilities in the County ROW" as follows: remove sentence that reads "Currently the Road Commission does not charge an application fee for public permits. Private utility permits applications are currently subject to the Board's adopted fee schedule for miscellaneous permits" and replace it with "Fees for permit applications, plan reviews and inspections are found on the current adopted permit fee schedule."

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. – Motion is approved.

Offer to extend seal coat slag (34-CS) by Elmers:

Elmers' Crane and Dozer will be able to supply enough 34-CS slag for next summer's seal coat program and has offered to extend this year's pricing into next year. Wagner reported staff was impressed with the material's performance and is recommending applying this material to local roads as well next summer. He offered his recommendation to accept the bid pricing.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa to authorize the Managing Director to accept Elmers' Crane and Dozer's offer to extend 2017 34-CS slag pricing to 2018.

Discussion: Popa expressed his concerns with the additional cost of using slag material on local roads next summer instead of using 31A stone historically used.

Vote: Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

2018 administrative staff raises:

Wagner presented his recommendation for a 2.0% cost of living wage adjustments for the administrative staff (excluding himself) starting the first payroll in 2018. This is the same rate increase scheduled for the union membership this July and mirrors the rates incorporated in the proposed 2018 Road Commission budget. Popa suggested that a motion to approve Wagner's recommendation should also include a 2.0% cost of living adjustment for Wagner.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to approve 2.0% cost of living wage adjustments for all administrative staff members effective at the start of the first pay period in 2018.

Discussion: Joyce stated he would like the Board to consider adjusting the Payroll Specialist's wages. Popa stated his opinion that it is the Manager's roll to make recommendations to the Board for administrative staff wage adjustments if he concludes an adjustment is needed.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion is approved.

Review and renew County road millage ballot language for 2018 primary election:

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa, to approve the 2018 road millage ballot language as presented and to ask the County Board of Commissioners to include the road millage renewal in the August 7, 2018 primary election. The proposal reads as follows:

Roads and Highways Maintenance and Repair Millage Renewal Proposal

For the sole purpose of funding general operating expenses to be incurred in maintenance and repair of roads and highways within the County of Leelanau, at the same millage level previously approved by the voters every two years since 1986, shall the Constitutional limitation upon the total amount of taxes which may be assessed in one (1) year upon all property within the County of Leelanau, Michigan, be renewed at 0.5000 mill (\$0.5000 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value) for a period of two (2) years (2018-2019) inclusive?

If approved and levied in full, this millage will raise an estimated \$1,318,484 for road and highway maintenance and repair general operating expenses in the first calendar year of the levy based on taxable value. In accordance with State law, the millage will be disbursed to the Leelanau County Road Commission, and the Villages of Empire, Northport, and Suttons Bay.

Ayes: Calhoun, Popa and Joyce. Nays: None. - Motion approved.

Nedow informed the Board the millage language was reviewed by the County's attorney David Stoker in December 2013. In addition, the total millage proceeds reported above will be revised this coming spring once property values have been adjusted for Board of Reviews, new home construction and home purchases. Wagner stated he will contact Leelanau County Administrator Janik to ask for an appointment with the Leelanau County Board of Commissioners in February 2018 to ask them to approve placing our road millage renewal request on the August 2018 primary ballot.

Request to make additional voluntary payment to MERS defined benefit pension plan:

Nedow reported that his year-end cash forecast indicates the Board could make a voluntary \$150,000 payment against the Road Commission's outstanding defined benefit unfunded liability obligation. Given the pension plan investments have so far generated a \$487,000 gain for the first three quarters of 2017 the market conditions are advantageous for making an additional contribution at this time.

Motion by Joyce, supported by Popa authorizing the Finance Manager to make an additional voluntary \$150,000 contribution to the Road Commission's Michigan Municipal Employees Retirement System Defined Benefit pension plan before year-end provided sufficient funds are available and doing so would be in the best interests of the Leelanau County Road Commission.

A regular meeting of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Leelanau County was called to order by Chairman Jim Calhoun at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 19, 2017 at 10550 E. Eckerle Road, Suttons Bay, Michigan. Present: Chairman Jim Calhoun, Vice-chairman John Popa, Member Robert Joyce, Managing Director Dan Wagner, Engineer James C. Johnson, Superintendent Dave Priest and Finance Manager/Secretary to the Board Joel Nedow. Guests were present.

Agenda: Approved as presented.

Vouchers 40288 thru 40344 in the amount of \$289,829.17 - approved for payment.

Minutes from the December 5, 2017 regular meeting - approved as presented.

Public Comments: None.

<u>Communications</u>: Email dated December 13, 2017 from Kenneth Arnt of Leelanau Township regarding Seth Road access. Arnt stated that after speaking to Gene and Kathy Garthe and Don Goheski who are of the opinion that the road segment from their house to the water's edge does not exist. Arnt is formally requesting that this road segment not be removed from the county maps and that it be re-opened.

Wagner stated that he had been contacted by several individuals interested in this topic so he had invited the parties to a meeting that he held yesterday at our office in Suttons Bay. He and Engineer Johnson discussed with them several items. This included what would be involved to re-establish a section of Seth Road that was made inaccessible some years ago; what would be involved to pursue abandoning a portion of Seth Road; and what would be involved to pursue establishing a new section of County Road to access private property to the west of Seth Road. He related that at this point there is nothing more for our agency to do and it will be up to the property owners to decide if they want to further pursue options.

Appointments: At 1:10 p.m. the Board met with Chris Butz, owner of Gills Pier Ranch who asked the Board to grant an exception to the Road Commission's commercial driveway curb and gutter requirement for a proposed bird hunting business on their property located on Hoxie Road. Butz stated that Solon Township is requiring a site plan review for this activity, which also requires Road Commission approval. He also stated that any additional traffic using the existing driveway would be minimal and expressed his opinion that upgrading the driveway would not be needed. Wagner stated that under the Road Commission's current standards, there are three types of driveways recognized: residential, multi-residential and commercial. Given these three classifications, the proposed driveway would be considered a commercial driveway, subject to our current upgrade standards.

After further discussion, the Board agreed to postpone any decision on the matter to allow staff ample opportunity to explore what options are available, if any.

Management Report - Wagner:

- -Handed out a document listing ten roads/segments for the Board to consider abandoning. The document includes map links showing the location of each road that was removed from the Road Commission's certification maps a few years ago. Wagner stated that he will be revising the list to include an additional twelve roads that Staff is suggesting be abandoned and will distribute the list prior to the January 16, 2018 Strategic Planning meeting.
- -Wagner reported that over 20% of our routes are manned by new drivers who have never plowed highways which have led to some mishaps which is understandable.
- -Efforts to evaluate some potential upgrades to our vehicle GPS tracking system are underway. Wagner has learned of new software that would enhance our current system to provide better feedback and tracking ability at a reasonable cost. One feature is the ability to have a "breadcrumb" trail that would allow us to see exact routes followed instead of snapshots. He hopes this feature will be helpful on weekends when we are not running a full crew allowing supervisors to see what roads have been plowed, and to determine if additional resources are needed.

The Board heard reports from Priest, Johnson and Nedow.

Resolution 17-08: adopt 2018 Road Commission budget:

Nedow reported correcting several punctuation errors as well as increasing Revenue – Township Contribution by \$25,000.00 which in turn also increased the 2018 year-end estimated cash balance by the same amount.

Motion by Popa, supported by Joyce to adopt Resolution 17-08 which reads as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED, that a public hearing was held on December 5, 2017 with no oral or written inquiries received regarding the proposed budget, and

BE IT RESOLVED that this resolution shall be both the general appropriation resolution and the budget adoption resolution of the Leelanau County Road Commission for the year ended December 31, 2017. This resolution adopts proposed revenues and expenditures as presented in the accompanying budget document. Total revenues are adopted as \$7,580,700.00 and total expenditures as \$7,576,020.00, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no Leelanau County Road Commission member or employee of the Commission shall expend any funds or obligate any expenditure except pursuant to appropriations authorized by the budget document. Changes in amounts appropriated by the Commission shall require approval of the Commission, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Finance Manager Joel T. Nedow is hereby charged with general supervision of the execution of the budget adopted by the Commission, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution is to take effect January 1, 2018.

Roll call vote: Joyce - aye; Popa - aye and Calhoun - aye. Nays: None. - Resolution is hereby adopted.
